Serinus canaria is endemic to Europe, where it is confined to the Canary Islands, Madeira and the Azores. Its population is relatively small (<100,000 pairs), but was apparently stable between 1970–1990. Trends were not available for any of the species's populations during 1990–2000, but there was no evidence to suggest that its status deteriorated. Consequently, it is provisionally evaluated as Secure.
