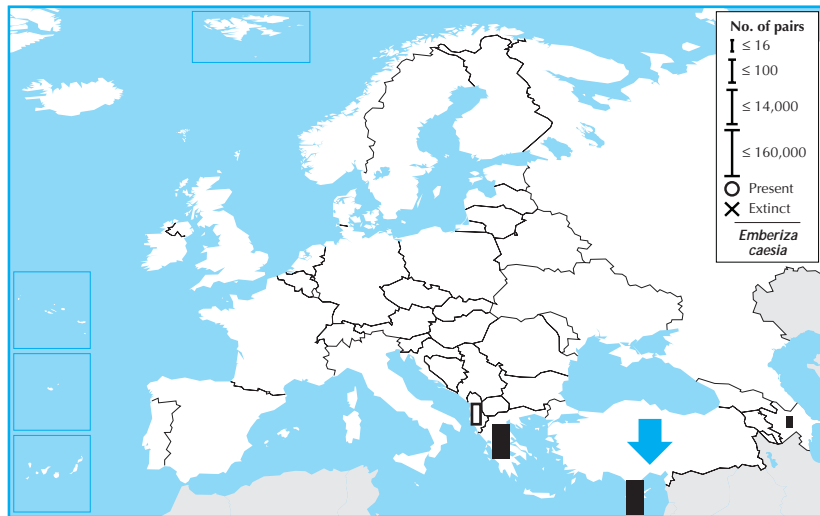

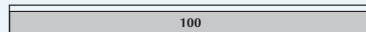


*Emberiza caesia* is a summer visitor to south-east Europe, which constitutes >75% of its global breeding range. Its European breeding population is large (>140,000 pairs), and was stable between 1970–1990. Although the species underwent a small decline in its Turkish stronghold during 1990–2000, its populations in Greece and Cyprus remained stable, and it probably declined only slightly overall. Consequently, it is provisionally evaluated as Secure.

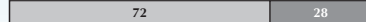

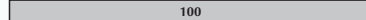
1990 population
