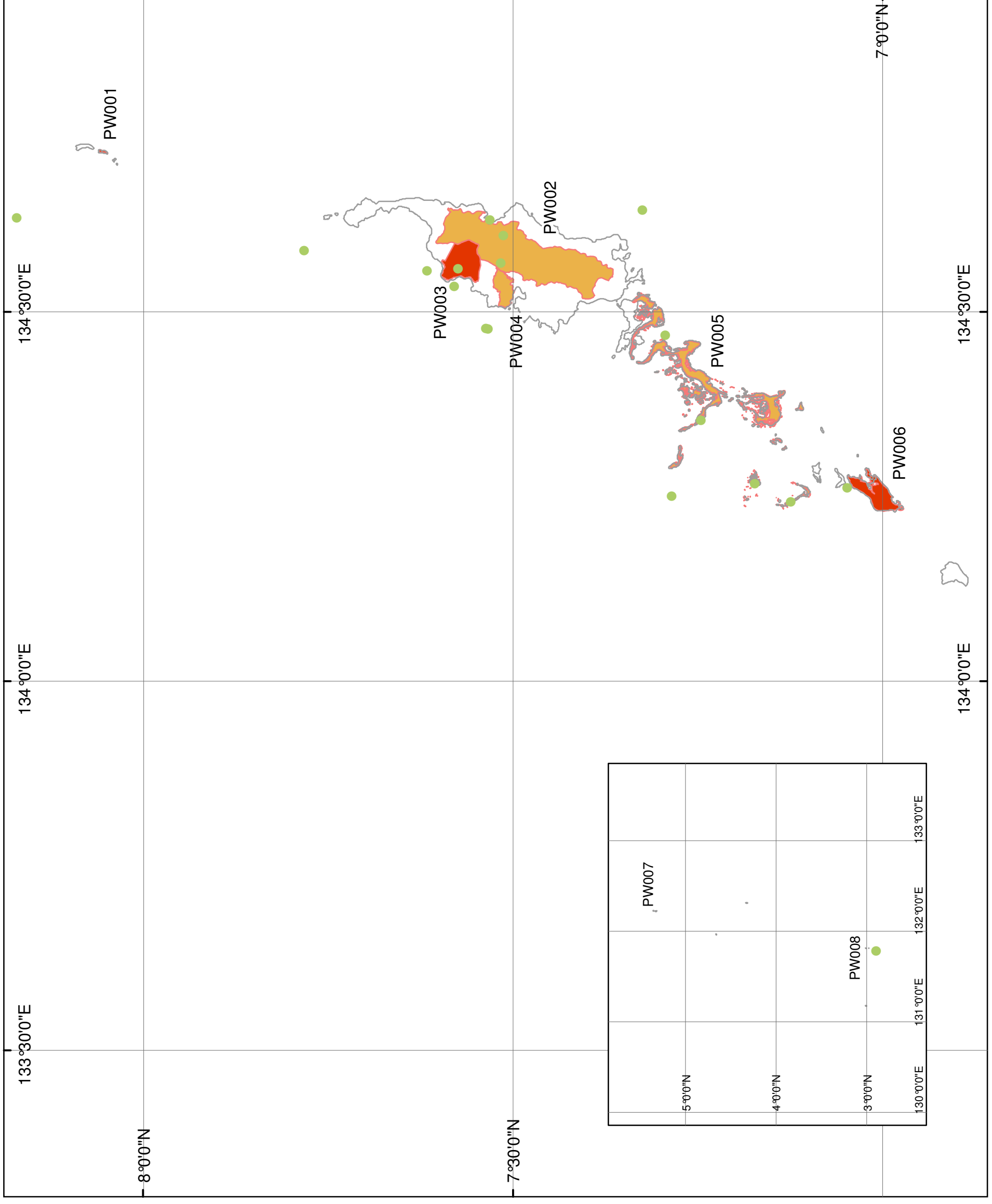
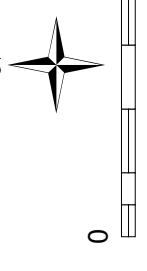


# Palau gap analysis: relationship between current protected area network and important sites for biodiversity
