Tetraogallus caucasicus is endemic to Europe, where it is confined to the Greater Caucasus Mountains of Russia, Georgia and Azerbaijan. Its breeding population is relatively small (<67,000 pairs), but the trend between 1970–1990 was unknown. Nevertheless, the species was thought to have been stable throughout its range during 1990–2000, and consequently it is evaluated as Secure.
