Tetraogallus caspius is resident in parts of Turkey and the Caucasus, with Europe accounting for less than a quarter of its global range. Its European breeding population is small (as few as 2,500 pairs), but its trend between 1970–1990 was unknown. Although no trend data were available for the Georgian population during 1990–2000, the species declined elsewhere in the Caucasus and in Turkey, and probably underwent a moderate decline (>10%) overall. As a consequence of this decline and its small population, this poorly known species is provisionally evaluated as Vulnerable.
