

Apus caffer has a predominantly African breeding distribution, which just extends into Europe in southern Spain and Portugal. Its European breeding population is very small (as few as 100 pairs), but increased markedly between 1970–1990. The species continued to increase in Iberia during 1990–2000, and underwent a large increase overall. Although the size of the European population could render it susceptible to the risks affecting small populations, it is marginal to a much larger non-European population. Consequently, the species is evaluated as Secure.
