Loxia leucoptera TWO-BARRED CROSSBILL



Loxia leucoptera is a widespread resident in the boreal zone of Russia and Fennoscandia, with Europe accounting for less than a quarter of its global range. Its European breeding population is very large (>1,000,000 pairs), and was stable between 1970–1990. The species remained broadly stable overall during 1990–2000, with fluctuations in Russia, Sweden and Norway, and increases in Finland. Consequently, the species is provisionally evaluated as Secure.
