Saxicola dacotiae is endemic to Europe, where it has a very small range (<1,000 km²) on the Canary Island of Fuerteventura. Its breeding population is very small (probably fewer than 1,250 pairs), and was stable between 1970–1990, but underwent a small decline during 1990–2000. As a consequence of its very small and declining population, and its very small range (which is declining owing to habitat degradation and destruction) on a single island, this globally threatened species is evaluated as Endangered.
