Oenanthe pleschanka is a widespread summer visitor to much of south-eastern Europe, which accounts for less than a quarter of its global breeding range. Its European breeding population is relatively small (<140,000 pairs), but was stable between 1970–1990. The species remained stable overall during 1990–2000, with all populations across its European range either stable or increasing. Consequently, it is provisionally evaluated as Secure
