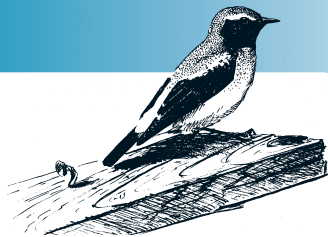


# *Oenanthe deserti*

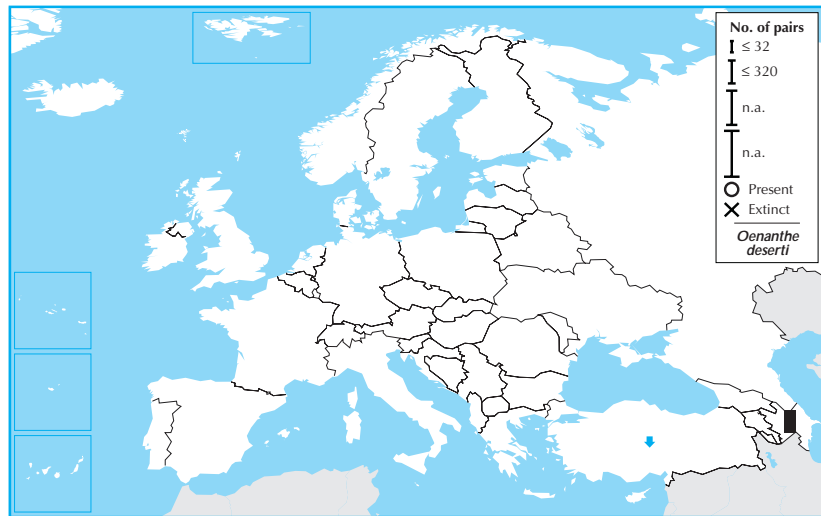

*Oenanthe deserti* breeds in Azerbaijan and Turkey, with Europe accounting for a tiny proportion of its global breeding range. Its European breeding population is very small (as few as 110 pairs), and its trend between 1970–1990 was unknown. The species declined in Turkey during 1990–2000, but was stable in Azerbaijan, and probably remained stable overall. Although the size of the European population could make it susceptible to the risks affecting small populations, it is marginal to a much larger non-European population. Consequently, it is provisionally evaluated as Secure.
