Major inconsistencies or loopholes detected (if yes please describe): The hunting season is extremely long. Some bird species (Corvidae) are hunted throughout the whole year. Often, the hunting of migrating birds already starts during the breeding seasons in summer and ends in spring only. The length of the hunting season is impacting the breeding bird populations in the country. There are no special forces in place that control hunting in Croatia.
