Hunting	Article 100 - It is prohibited to hunt, kill, catch, collect, harm, acquire or transport wild land and marine organisms, whether alive or dead or prejudice their juveniles, eggs, nests or their habitats, and the Executive Bylaw of this law shall determine the types and numbers of organisms allowed to be hunted or fished in certain seasons and specific areas. Hunting or fishing for scientific purposes shall be exempted after the approval of competent concerned authorities in coordination with the Authority.
