In Spain the powers on wildlife and hunting are transferred to the autonomous communities and therefore each region has at least two or three hunting laws. In Spain there are 17 regions and each region has its own legislation published in different years. In addition, some autonomous communities has regions with their own laws based on their historical land rights.
